Recommended Colleges and Universities

Applying to college is an exciting and yet confusing time! Where do I apply? What's right for me? What schools should I consider? These are all questions that may run through your mind as you browse for colleges to apply to. Here is our friendly reminder that UCLA, USC, CSULA, CSUN, etc. are not the only colleges in California—even more the world! Let's explore some of your other options...

<u>Cal State Universities:</u> Many of the Cal States that we are familiar with are <u>IMPACTED.</u> Meaning: the campus has MORE students than they can instructionally and physically accommodate. That's like a room with a 100-person capacity filled to the brim with 150 people! Here are a list of campuses that are NOT impacted:
